**Bob** sent the following message at 12:40 PM

That would be nice 😊

**Alice** sent the following message at 12:45 PM

Perhaps you can help me understand the cultural customs and business background here. This is the reason I saw and followed you when browsing for articles about Switzerland. This is a lucky day 😊

***Bob** sent the following message at 12:49 PM*

I would think so. Switzerland is very internationally oriented but still has some peculiarities one better should be aware of.

***Alice** sent the following message at 12:51 PM*

I agree with you that no matter where you develop your business network, you need to know more about the local culture, customs and business background. Of course, the scenery and food in Switzerland are also one of my hobbies 🙈

By the way, has the recent interest rate cut eased inflation in Switzerland? I think it is beneficial to businesses and individuals, but it is not suitable for the long term. Of course, this is just my personal opinion. Many people choose to invest in real estate, cryptocurrencies, and the gold market to preserve the value of their assets. What is your opinion on this?

***Bob** sent the following message at 1:33 PM*

Inflation is very low here. The prognosis for 2024 was 1.2% by the end of September, down 0.2% from the July prognosis. And of course, people tend to invest in crypto, gold, and real estate. But I think that is not without some risk.

*Alice sent the following message at 2:30 PM*



The Netherlands is an open economy that depends on foreign trade, so it may be more stressful than other countries. I am also a fan of cryptocurrencies. I agree with you that I do not recommend holding it for the long term. Its volatility is too high and difficult to control. I just hold a small amount of cryptocurrencies and some gold as jewelry. I use USDT more to do data-supported intraday trading of BTC/ETH/XAU to earn some passive income. Do you do the same?
